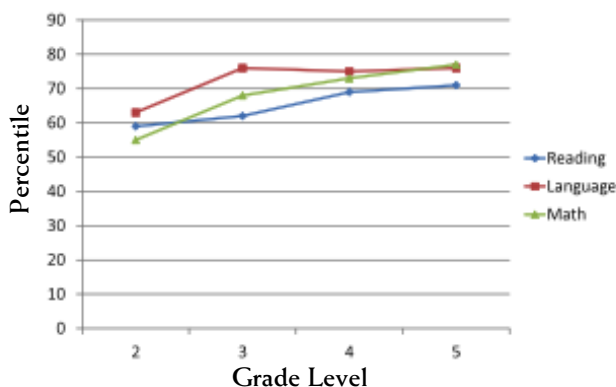

Results of UNCC Study of SAT-10 Outcomes

The graph below, taken from a field study conducted by the Center for Educational Measurement and Evaluation at UNCC, shows a history of student growth in key subjects for grades 2-5. Over a period of seven years, student achievement increased an average of 19 percentile points.

As part of this UNCC evaluation, classroom observations by Elaine O'Reilly enabled her to provide a description of student engagement, instructional strategies, and the quality of classroom environments.

In her report, Dr. O'Reilly wrote:

This observer has never seen the levels of student engagement in any other school. You can feel the extreme level of respect in every square foot of Brookstone, and this is a place where community standards are held high and modeled by the faculty, staff, students and parents. The students are held to incredibly high standards of behavior and they follow the lead.

The classroom climate was one of high expectations, respect amongst teachers and students, and a strong emphasis was put on the students to own responsibility for all of their actions and to follow directions and ask questions.



Fostering Creativity ... Forging New Programs



What's important to me is to know that my child is not only getting good academics, but is also being trained up with a Christian focus. When I first heard about Brookstone, I thought to myself... this mission sounds too good to be true. When I visited, I immediately sensed something special about the place. Suzuki Violin Class

Kindergarten through second grade students enjoy music-making in a free, before-school instrumental music program. Students learn to play the violin in small groups taught by a certified Suzuki violin teacher. Children also learn about composers and enjoy live lunchtime concerts at the school.

Fine Arts

We provide a stellar after-school program that allows Brookstone students to realize their creative abilities and to give back to the community. In 2012-2013, we offered Suzuki violin and choir, and in the 2013-2014 school year, we are adding a visual arts program and theatre.

Library

Brookstone provides a nurturing place for students to check out books and develop their reading skills. Our library is filled with thousands of books from a variety of authors, topics, and genres for children to explore.

Garden and Nutrition

This program has the potential to positively and permanently impact students using the "Seed to Stomach" concept. Children plant seeds, watch their plants grow and harvest their produce. They learn the value of healthy eating and ultimately dine on the very crops they have grown.



Hot Lunch

A nutritious lunch, prepared in our school kitchen and served daily, often includes the bounty of the school's own garden. Incorporating fruits and vegetables into a healthy diet can empower children to make better choices throughout their lives.

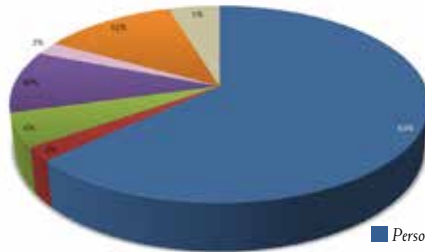
